



WICSA 2011: Call for Tutorial Proposals

The 9th Working IEEE/IFIP Conference on Software Architecture (WICSA 2011) in Boulder, Co., will offer tutorials on software architecture during the first and the last days of the conference (June 20 & 24), to allow practitioners and researchers to learn from each other, about cutting edge tools and methods.

The tutorial proposals will be reviewed by a small subset of the WICSA program committee. The criteria used will be: appropriateness to the theme and spirit of the conference, and the potential to draw an audience, especially in the local software industry.

Submission

A tutorial proposal should be no more than 4 pages and inform the following items: tutorial title, presenter name and coordinates, presenter bio (max 300 words), abstract (max 300 words); intended audience, proposed duration (the standard tutorial slot will be 1/2 day; only exceptionally will we accept a full-day tutorial); longer description and detailed outline of tutorial; previous deliveries of the tutorial (venue, date). Submit your proposal in PDF through Cyberchair on or before February 28, 2011.

Dates

February 28: last day for proposal submission (on Cyberchair)
March 21: Notification of acceptance
April 15: Registration opens
Mai 20: Close of early bird registration
Mai 23: Possible tutorial cancellation notice (if interest is too low)
June 3: Submission of tutorial handout material
June 20 & 24 Tutorial days
